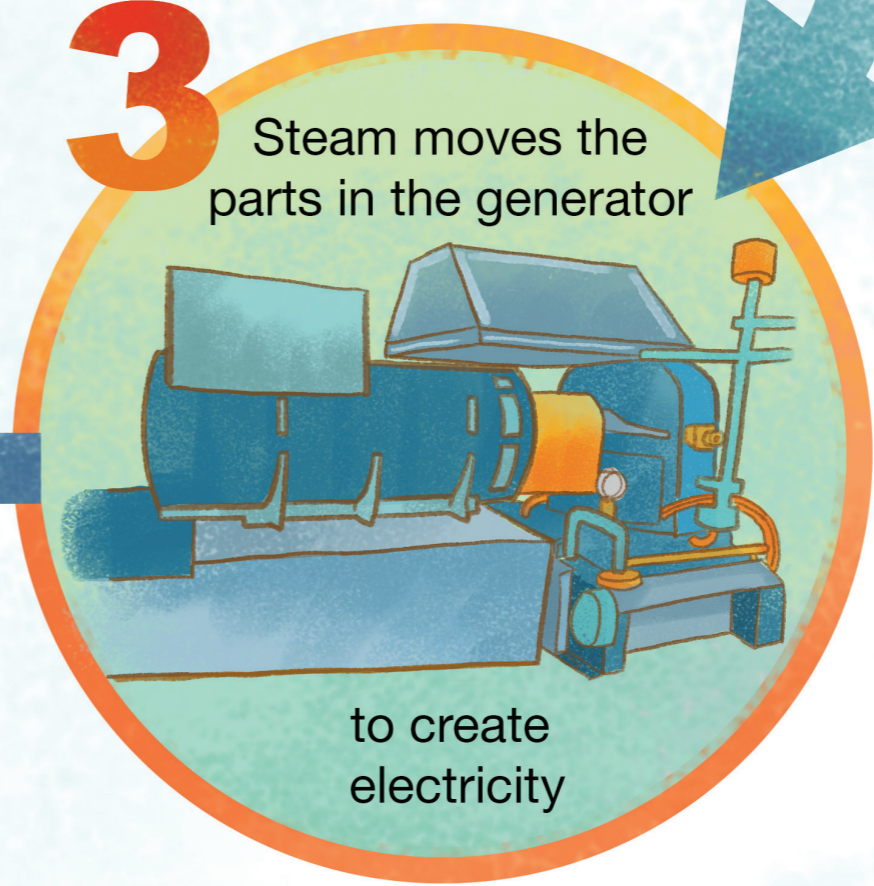
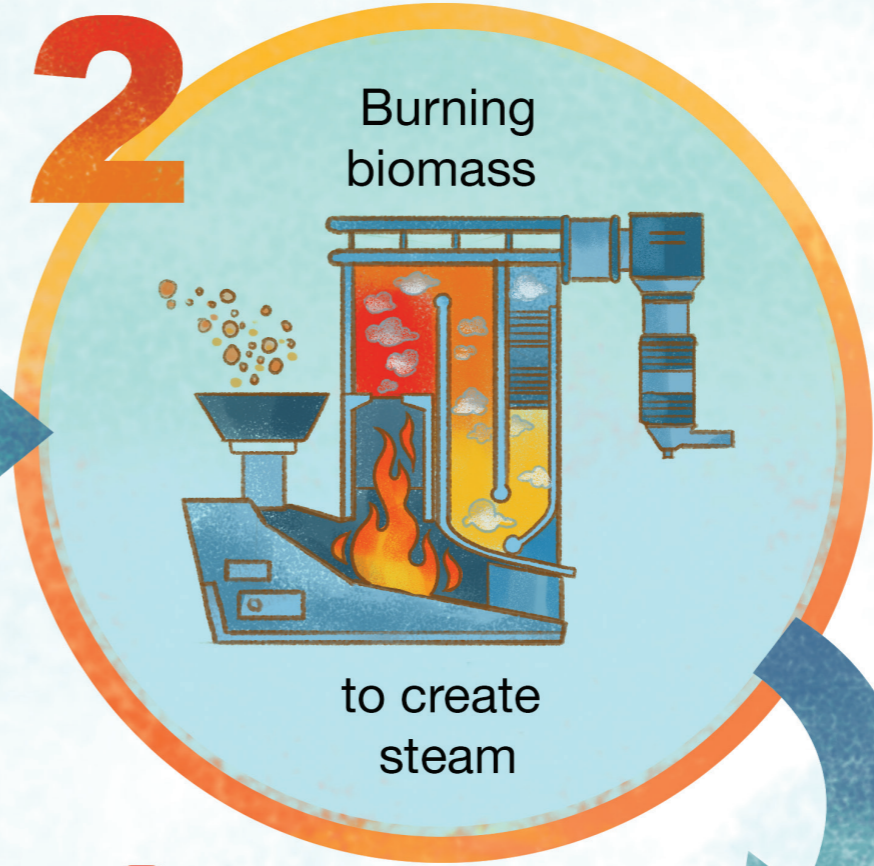
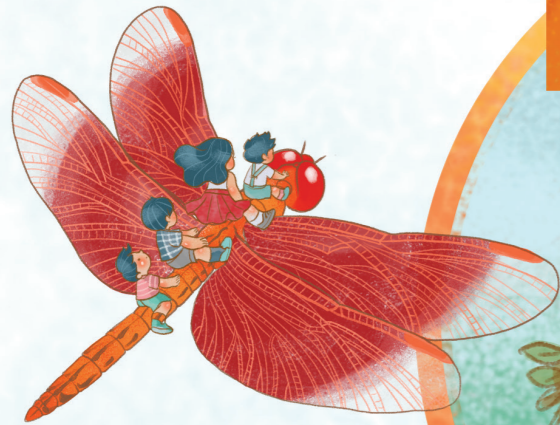


Fynn and the children are caught

Oh no! Watch out for that frog!



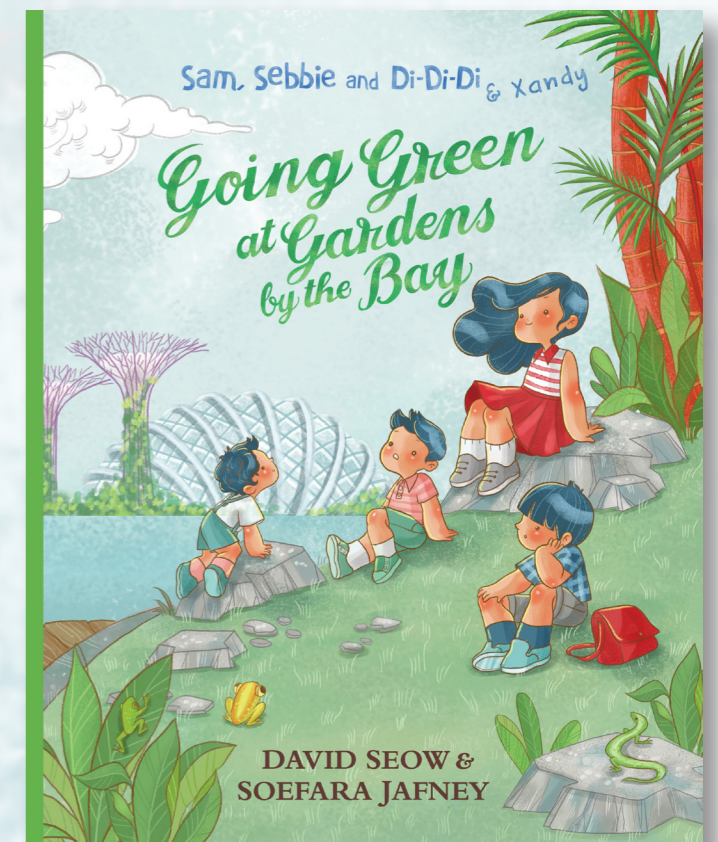
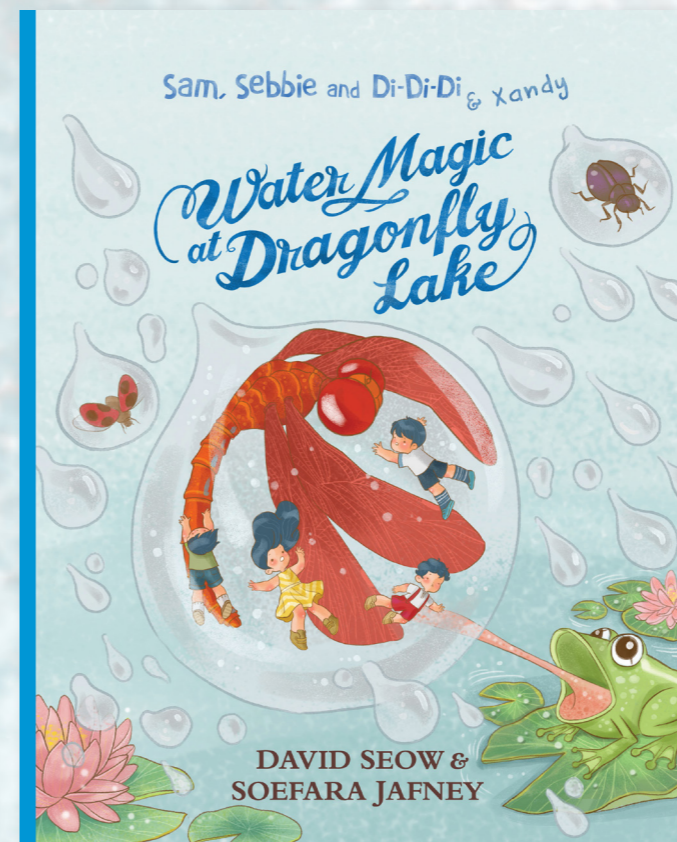
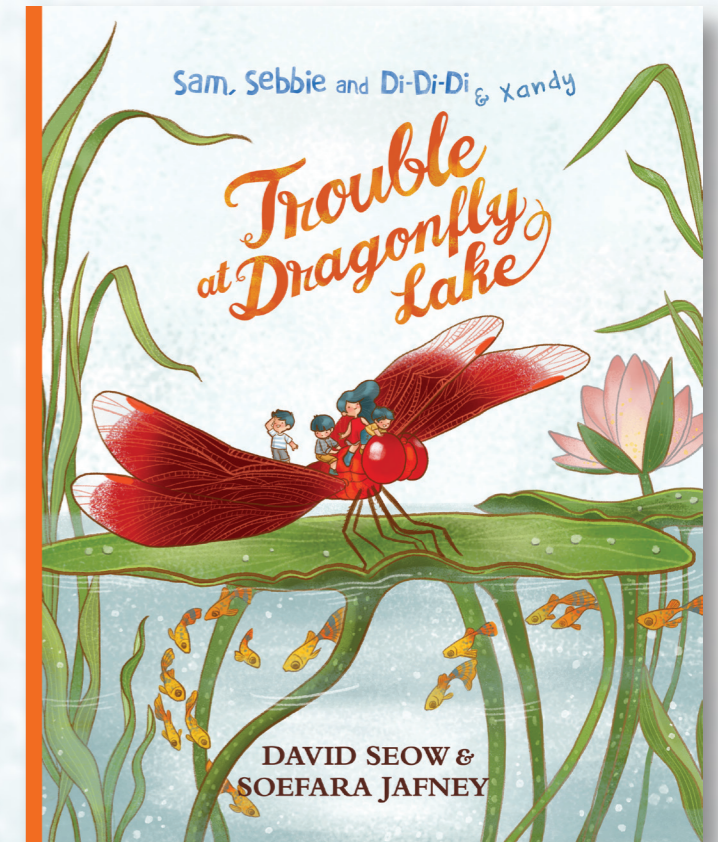


Besides learning about the water cycle, Sam, Sebbie, Di-Di-Di and Xandy also learn what it means to “GO GREEN” and about different energy sources.
